ELECTRICITY ACT 1989 THE ELECTRICITY WORKS (ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT) (ENGLAND AND WALES) REGULATIONS 2000 NOTICE OF SUBMISSION OF FURTHER ENVIRONMENTAL INFORMATION FOR THE LLANBRYNMAIR WIND FARM

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN UNDER REGULATION 14 of the above regulations that RES has at the request of the Secretary of State for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy (DBEIS) submitted Further Environmental Information (FEI) dated 29 March 2018 under the above regulations in addition to the Environmental Statement (dated 2009) and previous Supplementary Environmental Information (SEI) (dated 2010, 2012, 2013 & 2014) that accompanied its application under s36 Electricity Act 1989 made in 2009. The initial application sought consent for the above development which comprised thirty wind turbines with associated infrastructure, including plant and access tracks at Llanbrynmair, between the villages of Llanerfyl and Llanbrynmair, north west of Newtown, Powys. This application is now awaiting a final decision from the Secretary of State.
